Simi Settlers Amateur Radio Club General Membership Meeting, November 13, 2014

- <u>Call to Order</u>: Frank Valdez, KI6OQ, called the meeting to order at 7:05pm. Frank welcomed everyone to the meeting, held at the Simi Valley Senior Center. There was a recitation of The Pledge of Allegiance. Frank announced that he has decided to step up and fill the vacancy for the office of President. 11 Officers and Board Members/Advisors were present. The total attendance was 41, with 10 visitors.
- Introductions: A brief round of introductions was held. The Club welcomed guests
- <u>President</u>: Frank Valdez, who has been serving as acting president, announced that he will step up and take the office of President. This now leaves a vacancy for the office of Vice President. Until a new Vice President is found, Frank will continue as acting Vice President. Frank said that anyone interested in the office of Vice President should contact a Board member or to come to a Board meeting. The Board meets on the 4th Thursday of the month at 7pm at the Senior Center in room 122. (Note that due to Thanksgiving, the Board Meeting for November has been moved to Monday, December 1, at the same place and time.)
- <u>Youth Coordinator</u>: Frank announced that Dante Smith, KK6JCQ, has offered to serve as the Club's Youth Coordinator. Frank moved that the Club accept Dante's offer. This motion was seconded and passed by a unanimous show of hands vote.
- Announcements: Frank expressed thanks to those who attended and helped put on the Club's Picnic in October. The Club's annual Holiday Party is set for Saturday, December 13, at 6pm at the home of Jim and Lea Veronica. More information is in the November newsletter. Jim Hutchinson, KI6MZ, reported that 27 of the SST Antennas were built. He said many builders did not pick up the length of PVC pipe for mounting and the wooden coax stand-off.
- Program: President Frank Valdez, KI6OQ introduced our program speakers, Avi Carmi, K6AVI, and Rick Slater, AG6AY, who spoke on the topics of SWR and Antenna Analyzers. Avi began with several audio/video presentations; "SWR Exposed", and a good animation showing how forward and reflected waves combine to produce standing waves. Also he had an ARRL video showing a number of different SWR analyzers that are available. He then gave a demo of his RigExpert graphic Antenna Analyzer. Then Rick Slater talked about the theory of 2-Port analyzers and showed his "Mini VNA" analyzer. He demonstrated how it gave a graphical plot for transmission through a 20 Meter Band Pass filter. Avi and Rick ended their program by showing a fascinating vintage Bell Labs video of a mechanical "wave machine" that demonstrates waves and wave reflections. At the end of the program Frank presented Avi and Rick with certificates of appreciation from the Simi Settlers.
- Break: A 20-minute break was taken at 8:32pm, with members enjoying refreshments.
- <u>Member Drawing</u>: The winning name in the progressive Membership drawing was Kim Galbraith, W6KJG. She was not present to win the \$10 prize, so for our next regular meeting on Jan. 8, 2015, the prize will increase to \$20. Members must be present to win, and the prize grows by \$10 each month it is unclaimed.
- <u>Prize Raffle</u>: The featured "Grand Prize" at this month's raffle, a Baofeng UV-5R Handheld, was won by Ray Campbell, KI6LKD.
- Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 9:00pm
