Simi Settlers Amateur Radio Club General Membership Meeting, May 11, 2017

Call to Order: President, Frank Valdez, KI6OQ, called the meeting to order at 7:02pm. Frank welcomed everyone to the

meeting, held at the Simi Valley Senior Center. There was a recitation of The Pledge of Allegiance. 7 Officers and Board Members/Advisors were present. The total attendance was 24, with 4 visitors.

Introductions: A brief round of introductions was made. Visitors Roger Gale, KB6HDN, Dick Norton, N6AA, Rick Roome,

WA6QGG, and John Seybold, KG6VK, were welcomed.

Announcements: Frank said that our Treasurer, Glenn Daly, WA6GNB was ill today, so Jim Parker, KJ6LXJ, is substituting for

Glenn at this meeting. Frank said that Diane Rehaut is doing better after an illness. Steve King, KE6WEZ, said we will have a joint ACS and SSARC booth this Saturday at the Simi Valley Street Fair and Emergency Expo, on Cochran Street. The Spring Picnic will be held at the home of Jim and Lea Veronica on Saturday, May 20. Jim said it would be best to start the Picnic at 11:00am since there is no shade in his back yard

before that time.

<u>Election</u>: Frank reminded members that our Election will be held at the June meeting, and we still need volunteer

candidates for President, Vice President, P.I.O. and News Letter Editor.

Mesh Update: Orv Beach, W6BI, spoke about the recent improvements to the Simi Valley Mesh Network. Orv sketched a

map of the valley to show how new additions to the three nodes; Chatsworth Peak, Mellow Lane, and the north end of Sycamore, will improve coverage and the flow of traffic. The use of 3 and 5GHz frequencies will

help spread out the passing of traffic.

Program: Frank introduced Dick Norton, N6AA, Director of the ARRL South Western Division, who spoke about the

ARRL and recent matters of interest to Radio Amateurs. He began with some of his history with 62 years as a licensed Ham and travels to many parts of the world for DX operation. Dick briefly spoke about the ARRL's new Code of Conduct for its Board of Directors. Regarding the new "Distracted Driving" law that California enacted in January 2017, Dick said it is being looked to determine the effects for mobile Ham operating. He said that radios with corded microphones seem to be OK, but use of handheld radios like "HTs" while driving may be cited. Concerning antenna restrictions, the League has been meeting and negotiating with the national association of HOAs. Dick said that he feels the new Amateur Radio Parity Act, HR 555, now in the Senate, has both plusses and minuses. Another issue the ARRL has been looking at is the population imbalance that has developed among the Divisions and Sections of the ARRL organization. Dick said that for now no changes have been made. Noting a slight decrease in ARRL membership since the dues increase,

Dick mentioned many of the benefits of League membership. After questions, Frank thanked Dick and

presented him with a certificate of appreciation from the Simi Settlers.

Break: At 8:05pm, a 12-minute break was taken with refreshments provided by Bill Everett, KI6KSV.

Field Day: Rick Slater, AG6AY, gave an update on planning for the VCARS-SSARC Field Day at the Reagan

Presidential Library. There are openings for operators for the 10Meter, 15Meter and 80Meter Phone bands. At this point it looks like we will have a smaller operation, perhaps as an "8A" class. Rick said the station layout will be about the same as those used last year. Frank, KI6OQ, said the SSARC will again organize the Saturday night dinner. We are planning to have Red's Barbecue, Tri-Tip and Chicken, and the cost per

person will be \$15.

Member Drawing: The winning name in the progressive Membership drawing was Jussi Eloranta, AA6KJ, who was not present

to win the \$40 prize. The prize amount will be increased to \$50 for our next regular meeting on June 8, 2017.

Members must be present to win, and the prize grows by \$10 each month it is unclaimed.

Prize Raffle: After the prize raffle drawing, the Grand Prize winner of a Baofeng UV-B6 Dual Band HT was Steve Noll,

WA6EJO.

Growing the Ranks vs. Growing the Enjoyment

Because I teach amateur radio classes and publish a series of popular amateur radio license study guides (www.kb6nu.com/study-guides/), I often get kudos for "growing the ranks." In fact, Gordon West, WB6NOA, told me this just last week, when he stopped by the booth I was in at the Dayton Hamvention. I'm paraphrasing a little, but after telling me that he's heard good things about my study guides, he said something like, "You're doing good work in helping get more people into ham radio."

People say that as if this is—or should be—the ultimate goal of teaching a license class. While this may be one of the goals, if that's your primary goal, I think that you're barking up the wrong tree.

In a way, creating more hams is selfish. If there are more licensed amateur radio operators, they say, then amateur radio will have more political clout with the FCC and with Congress, making it easier to pass legislation like the Amateur Radio Parity Act. While this may certainly help the new ham down the line, its main thrust is to reduce restrictions on those who are currently hams.

My goal in teaching amateur radio classes isn't to create more hams. Instead, my goal is to help more people have fun with ham radio. The first step in helping people have fun with ham radio is, of course, helping them get their license. I do that by publishing my study guides and teaching ham classes.

The next step, and I'm only really getting started on this right now, is to help people learn what they need to know to become better ham radio operators. That's why I got a little excited when I saw the article, "Making a Good hobby Better Through Post-Licensing Enrichment" by Tim Busch, NOCKR in the latest issue of *Radio Waves*, the ARRL's email newsletter for amateur radio instructors.

In the article, Tim describes several activities that his club encourages, including a "new ham net" and the Field Day GOTA station, but he also details a program of "mini classes" that will teach specific skills related to ham radio. These include:

- Programming Radios and Getting on the Air
- Soldering 101
- Multimeter 101
- Build and Use a Roll-Up J-Pole Antenna
- Build and Use a Satellite Antenna
- Foxhunts
- Operating Digital Modes: IRLP, AllStar, D-Star, EchoLink, etc.
- Remote Operation
- Software-Defined Radios
- Transitioning from VHF/UHF to HF Operating
- Chasing Awards
- Learn CW
- Contesting

Tim writes, "Each class is intended to be no more than two hours at a sitting, so they can be held before a monthly club meeting. The variety of subject matter allows many club members to get involved in leading a topic. Materials kits are prepared in advance, so students walk away with practical items they can use at home."

I think this is a great set of classes, and I plan to try some of these in the fall. A couple of other topics that occur to me are:

- Power Supplies 101
- Mobile Operation 101
- ARRL 101
- RFI/TVI 101

Helping new hams—and old hams—have more fun with amateur radio is a lot more satisfying to me than just "growing the ranks." It would be nice to say that we have a million licensed radio amateurs in the U.S., but I think it would be a lot more valuable to the hobby to say that a larger percentage of licensed hams were active and enjoying ham radio. I know that, for me, increasing the number of active, engaged hams would be more personally satisfying than simply creating a lot of new licensees.

State of the Digital Mesh Network – Simi Valley and Surrounds

We continue to expand and make improvements on the still-young digital mesh network in the area. Here are some highlights:

The 3 GHz local backbone has been installed. It links Chatsworth Peak to the Mellow Lane repeater site, then from there to the Sycamore Road radio site. It has good performance – the links run at least 6 Megabits/second in both directions – but we have plans to make it run even faster!

We've added one new mesh station that I'm aware of: Rusty, K1GGS in Wood Ranch.

Jay AG6JF, Steve KE6WEZ, Rusty K1GGS and I spent some time at Mellow Lane on Memorial Day. We made the following changes:

- Upgraded the Nanostaton M3 pointing at CP to a Rocket M3
 + 120 degree sector antenna to try to improve the link (it helped some).
- Swapped out the Ethernet switch hooking the four nodes up there together for a Ubiquiti Toughswitch, which can be managed remotely.
- Turned the TP-Link 2 GHz node to a bearing between Jay AG6JF and Rusty K1GGS (approximately 285 degrees).
- Added an Ubiquiti Nanostation M5 (5 Gigahertz) pointing 270 degrees as Rusty has purchased both an NSM2 and NSM5.



We've started a weekly net using "Teamtalk" which allows us to chat via voice over the digital mesh network. We meet at 8 p.m. every Sunday night, a half-hour before the Simi Settlers FM voice net. We've had as many as half a dozen users join the net on the w6bi-vc-mesh-info Teamtalk server. Callsigns seen have been: W6BI, KE6WEZ, KM6FQ, N6OOR, AG6JF, K6NE and KG6WXC. If your digital mesh station has a good signal into the network the audio voice quality is excellent, far better than "communications grade". Teamtalk supports video too, and we've had several webcams going at the same time with reasonably good results.

Future plans for Simi Valley include better user coverage from the Sycamore and Mellow Lane sites, emergency power for those two sites and a camera at Mellow Lane.

Other plans include extending the network into the San Fernando Valley this summer, with a 2 GHz user access point on Verdugo Peak.
