<u>New Officers</u> :	The theme of this meeting was to "Meet the New President". Treasurer's Report:	Treasurer Glenn Daly, WA6GNB, reported The Club's current financial balance is \$1,038.	
<u>Announcements</u> :	Rick Galbraith said he brought many boxes of books, parts and some equipment, from Silent Key Spencer Smith, N6IWY. Members are welcome the take the books and other items. A tentative date of October 28 th has been set for our Fall picnic. Rick will confirm reservation for the gazebo and tables at the Rancho Madera Park. There will be a Solar eclipse on Monday, August 21. Charles, WB6MIO, mentioned there will be radio experiments during the eclipse, and Joe, W6JWP, said there will be an Eclipse QSO party on the air. Our Club has been invited to participate at "Rocket Day" (AKA: "The Fires of Creation") a special event at the Strathearn Historical Park and Museum on November 18. We need to see if we have members interested in setting up portable operating stations like we have done at "History Day" using our Club callsign W6SVS.

Field Day Report:	Frank Valdez, KI6OQ, gave a wrap-up of our Field Day. He spoke about the stations and band/modes we used, and the food that we provided from Red's Barbecue. Frank said Field Day is such a great event, he recommends members should try to participate next year. President Mike said this was our 17 th Field Day at the Regan Presidential Library. He spoke about some of experiences we had with rigs and antennas. He also mentioned the statistics that Rick Slater, AG6AY, compiles from the Logging data. A link to the data spreadsheets will be sent out to members. Mike reminded us that we put emphasis on engaging the Public at F.D. and the contest is second priority.	
<u>Program</u> :	Mike Hasenfratz gave a "Get to know your President" talk, relating his interests in Ham Radio since he was licensed in 1974. He is retired electrical engineer from Northrop Grumman. He is active with software defined radio (SDR) using his Flex 6700 rig with a SteppIR antenna. Digital Mesh Network News for Ventura County and Surrounds – Orv W6BI

Work continues on expanding our digital mesh network. In Simi Valley we've added 5 GHz access points alongside the existing 2 GHz access points at our three radio sites: Chatsworth Peak, north end of Sycamore, and the Mellow Lane site. 5 GHz has advantages over 2 GHz in that the band is quieter, we can use more bandwidth (20 MHz vs 10 MHz on the 2 GHz band), and the gear is not much more expensive than the 2 GHz equipment.

Local hams that have moved to 5 GHz for their primary network access are: W6BI, WB2YXY, N6OOR KM6FQ WA6GNB and K1GGS.

We established a 2 GHz user access node on Verdugo Peak several months ago. The link between Verdugo Peak and Chatsworth Peak failed shortly thereafter due to an unrelated link issue. We hope to have that link repaired soon. Verdugo Peak has one user, Dave N3BKV in Burbank, with a good quality link. He's linked in to the rest of the network temporarily via an Internet tunnel graciously supplied by Eric KG6WXC in Port Hueneme. Dave has very generously purchased a 5 GHz user access point for Verdugo Peak and it's being prepared for deployment soon. Props to Dave!

Justin, K6BFG in Chatsworth is working towards adding 2 and 5 GHz user access points in the very northwest corner of the San Fernando Valley. We hope to link them to Verdugo Peak via 3 GHz

IRC is Internet Relay Chat. It's a keyboard to keyboard protocol, with channels. We've connected the Simi Valley IRC server to one in Oxnard and then on to one in Santa Barbara. A ham logged into his nearest IRC server can chat with users on all three servers.

Work continues towards hardening all three sites in Simi Valley. The Settlers have graciously donated money towards backup batteries for the Chatsworth Peak site. The other two sites need some backup loving too!

Plans are firming up to extend the backbone from Verdugo Peak farther east, to eventually connect to JPL and then on to Orange County. There's no specific time frame, but some of the prep work may happen in September, after equipment has been acquired.

If you're going to Hamcon 2017 this month, Andre Hansen K6AH, one of the AREDN (Amateur Radio Emergency Data Network) principles, will be making a presentation. He gives an interesting talk on digital mesh networking. Recommended.
