FT8 - DX Without Sunspots.

Sunspots are an important energizer of DX communications. The number of sunspots follows an approximately 11 year cycle. We are currently nearing the bottom of Cycle 24. HF propagation has been very poor for a few years and will continue to be bad or worse for several years to come.

New digital modes have been invented that use advanced signal and data processing to enable radio communications in spite of poor conditions. FT8 is one of the most effective and popular new modes.

Come hear about how you can use this mode to make both DX and domestic contacts in the doldrums of Cycle 24.


We will have a "White Elephant" table where you can sell (ham) stuff with at least half the proceeds being donated to SSARC.

What's Happening on Hamnet?

There's a lot of ham network activity going on! Here's what's been done and what's planned for the next few months locally:

Simi North (north end of Sycamore Road)

We recently upgraded the 3 GHz radio at Simi North. It had been a little Ubiquiti Nanostation M3. It's still an M3 (the bottom plastic box on the mast in

the before photo) but we hung it on the feed point of a dish that looks something like a satellite TV dish. It gave us about 9 dB higher SNR on the link going to Simi West (Mellow Lane). See the before and after photos (the after photo shows Eric KE6MLF hanging off the tower after he did all the heavy lifting).





Also planned for Simi North is a 5 GHz upgrade. We'll be replacing the 5 GHz Nanostation there with a 120 degree sector antenna from Altelix, driven by a Ubiquiti Rocket M5 radio. While the Altelix antenna has only slightly more gain than the Nanostation, it applies that gain over 120 degrees of horizontal beam width, compared to 43 degrees of beam width for the Nanostation. This will give us much better coverage of the middle half of our valley.

We recently removed one small dead tree from the site, and will later remove a large tree (also dead) with the owner's permission, to get a better view for the camera for the hills on the south side of our Valley.



Simi East (Chatsworth Peak)

We've had a PTZ camera on hand for Chatsworth Peak for a number of months. We were going to wait until the site got re-cabled prior to installing the camera. But that re-cabling has been deferred so we've decided to go ahead and replace the defunct fixed focus camera there with this shiny new PTZ camera. We hope to have

that completed in the next month. It will have a view similar to this photo. In addition to have a good view of the east end of the valley, it will be able to see parts of the 118 freeway as it comes through the pass.

Other stuff

More channels!

With the steady expansion of the network, having all 5 GHz nodes on the same channel in the county is becoming problematic. I've sent a proposal to SCRRBA (the Southern California Repeater and Remote Base Association - the frequency coordination organization for everything above 220 MHz locally) to spread our nodes out across the band. I asked for a lot; we'll see how they respond:-)



Software upgrade

The AREDN team recently released a major upgrade of the networking firmware. Since then almost all hilltop nodes in Ventura County have been upgraded. The upgrade removes some bugs, closes some security holes and adds some new features.

Other areas

With the help of some Conejo Valley hams, we're scoping out several candidate sites for better coverage of the CV. The current site on Rasnow doesn't cover anything south of the 101 and west of about Moorpark Road. The photo is a 180 degree panorama (centered about WNW) taken near one of the candidate sites on the east side of the valley.

Activities

Our Wednesday night Teamtalk net is slowly growing. We had 7 people check in recently. Maybe we should start taking Teamtalk check-ins for the Tuesday night nets:-)

Dave KM6FQ has been doing some mesh network "wardriving" lately. He's got some software that will continually poll a couple of nodes in his car (connected to omni antennas on top). The software records lat/long, signal strength and a few other things about any other nodes heard on that channel. He's done a few test drives in Moorpark and western Simi Valley and sent the results to me, which I plotted on a heat map. We'll continue to refine the procedure and cover more territory to determine where our coverage is lacking.

If you're interested in trying ham networking I have a node or two I can loan out.

<u>Call to Order</u>: The meeting was called to order at 7:02 pm by Vice President, Jim Veronica, WA6NXK. Jim

welcomed everyone to the meeting, held at the Simi Valley Senior Center. There was a

recitation of The Pledge of Allegiance.

8 Officers and Board Members/Advisors were present. The total attendance was 30, with 6

visitors.

Introductions: There was a round of introductions for members and guests. The club welcomed visitors Vern

Potter, W6NCT, Rick Slater, AG6AY, Eric Harshberger, KM6ZXL, Don Anderson, Caleb Anderson,

KM6ZCT, and guest speaker Mark Weiss, K6FG.

Announcements: Rick Galbraith said that long time past member Larry Pyle, AD6ST, is in a hospital in Los

Angeles. Rick said he has a get-well card for members to sign for Larry.

Jim Veronica said that a Club Picnic has tentatively been set for Saturday, May 4, at his home.

It will be potluck, with the Club providing burgers, hot dogs, and soft drinks.

Constitution/Bylaws: Bill Woods reported that the latest vote count was now 45 votes "FOR" and zero against the

adoption of the updated Constitution and Bylaws documents. This exceeded the required two

thirds majority of the paid membership to approve the documents.

<u>Election</u>: Following the resignation of President Mike Hasenfratz in February, an election was held to

install a new President. Vice President Jim Veronica asked for nominations from the floor. Two candidates were nominated; Bill Woods, AB6BW, and Brian Hernandez, KM6MIN. While the two candidates stepped out of the room, a show-of-hands vote was taken. There were 15 votes for Bill, and 5 votes for Brian. Bill Woods was thus declared to be elected to serve out

the current term as President, through June of this year.

Field Day: Vern Potter, W6NCT, Stu Sheldon, AG6AG, and Rick Slater, AG6AY spoke about this year's Field

Day event that will be Saturday and Sunday, June 29 and 30. Vern said the Library is welcoming us back again, but parking will still be a problem. Stu explained a few Field Day rules that came up last year related to a person operating at more than one site, and the use of emergency power. He also mentioned the importance of having a control operator at every

station.

Program: President Bill Woods introduced our guest speaker, Mark Weiss, K6FG, who spoke about

"Remote Ham Radio". This is operating a fixed station from a different location. He said the reasons include; travel, antenna restrictions at home, emergencies, and just to have fun. He explained how the internet is used to operate a rig from any location. Mark showed the interface screen of the ICOM RS-BA1 remote control software. He mentioned websites "remotehamradio.com" and "remotehams.com", and an article in QST-April 2017, for good information. After the program, Mark was presented with a certificate of appreciation from

SSARC.

Break: A 15-minute break was taken, with refreshments provided by Bill Everett, KI6KSV.

Member Drawing: The progressive Membership drawing was held. The winning name drawn was Bill Woods,

AB6BW, who was present to win the \$10 prize. The prize amount will therefore start over with \$10 for our April 11, 2019 meeting. Members must be present to win, and the prize

grows by \$10 each month it is unclaimed.
